To this end, I believe that the [Congress or Senate] should adopt a resolution recommending the criminal prosecution for sedition and treason of Keith Alexander, James Clapper, and all others responsible for forming and implementing NSA policy; and that these individuals be executed upon being found guilty of these crimes. The death penalty is clearly the appropriate punishment for these heinous crimes against the Constitution and the American people, we must send the strongest possible message to those who would dare to erect a police-state surveillance infrastructure within the United States.
